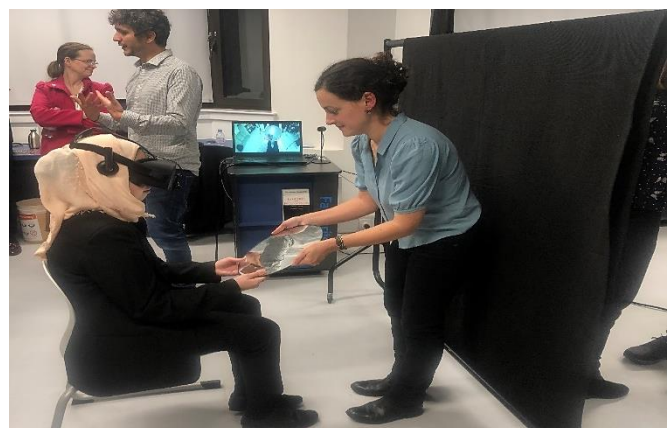

We asked staff and students to suggest books to add to the reading list. After a rigorous student selection process, our longlist of a hundred books was reduced to a shortlist of ten.

The Tottenham Ten is a reading list chosen by our students, for our students and aims to reflect and appeal to the majority of our student body.

During an assembly on Tuesday 4th February, each book on the list was championed by a student or staff member resulting in some impressive expositions. Since then, the Tottenham Ten titles have generated much excitement and copies have been flying off the library shelves!

Ten books chosen by LAET students for LAET students



- 'Brave New World' (1931) by Aldous Huxley: a dystopian vision set in a futuristic world inhabited by genetically modified citizens and an intelligence-based hierarchy.
- 'Americanah' (2013) by Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie: the story of a young Nigerian woman who moves to the United States to attend University, where she confronts racism for the first time.
- 'The Perks of Being a Wallflower' (1999) by Stephen Chbosky: an American coming of age epistolary novel which follows an introverted teenager through high school.
- 'The Hate U Give' (2017) by Angie Thomas: a story of race and identity in which 16-year-old Starr Carter moves between the poor neighbourhood where she lives and the rich prep school that she attends.
- 'The Handmaid's Tale' (1985) by Margaret Atwood: set in the near-future in a totalitarian state, where women attempt to regain their individuality and independence.
- 'Things Fall Apart' (1958) by Chinua Achebe: a chronicle of pre-colonial Nigerian life and the arrival of the Europeans at the end of the nineteenth century.
- 'The Kite Runner' (2003) by Khaled Hosseini: the story of Amir, a young boy living in Kabul, that also plots Afghanistan's political landscape through to the rise of the Taliban.
- 'Slaughterhouse 5' (1969) by Kurt Vonnegut: a science-fiction infused anti-war novel that focuses on the fire-bombing of Dresden in the Second World War.
- 'Fingersmith' (2002) by Sarah Waters: a historical thriller set between the contrasting worlds of petty thieves and a rich heiress in Victorian London.
- 'The Secret History' (1992) by Donna Tartt: a New England thriller that tells the story of a group of six students at an elite American college.

A number of these books contain harrowing scenes and you may wish to ask for content advice before taking them out of the library.

Scholars' Programme

Students arriving to LAE Tottenham with the highest prior attainment are welcomed onto our scholars' programme. This year, LAET scholars' have met on a weekly basis to extend their thinking, broaden their horizons and prepare for study at top academic institutions.

Students have been exposed to academic sessions on new disciplines including anthropology, philosophy and alternative STEM programmes. Along with all students, they have been encouraged to exploit cultural opportunities in and beyond London by visiting the Wellcome Collection and completing online university courses through platforms such as Futurelearn. A number of scholars' attended the Oxford Vs Cambridge Varsity rugby match at Twickenham in December where they also completed workshops on preparing application to Oxford and Cambridge.

Next term, scholars' will be watching academic presentations from Year 13 students and then researching towards their own presentations to be delivered in the style of a university seminar.



Careers Programme

February sees the launch of the LAE Tottenham careers programme for Year 12. All students have chosen one of the following pathways: Business/Finance, Creative Industries/Journalism/Marketing, Digital & Computing, Engineering, Healthcare, Psychology, Law and Politics.

Students will receive tailored talks in their chosen pathway as well as CV, cover letter and interview preparation support, from both LAE Tottenham staff and industry experts. Our students will experience a taste of working in their chosen industry pathway through participating in a real workplace challenge, which replicates a situation an employee would face in that industry.

All LAET students will also attend a Careers Fair at Highgate School, where they have an opportunity to network with a range of employers as well as apply to work experience programmes with prestigious firms advertised through the Careers Classroom. Many of these opportunities are bespoke for students at LAE Tottenham.
